RESOLUTION NO. 84 (90)

A RESOLUTION OF THE NORTHERN CHEYENNE TRIBAL COUNCIL PROVIDING FOR PARTICIPATION OF THE CHIEFS AND WARRIOR SOCIETIES AND ITS TASK FORCE IN THE RESTORATION OF TRIBAL HEADQUARTERS, REVISIONS TO THE TRIBAL CONSTITUTION AND IN THE FORMULATION OF POLICY CONCERNING ANTICIPATED CHANGES TO BE BROUGHT ABOUT BY THE NEW FEDERALISM POLICIES OF THE U.S. CONGRESS FOR AMERICAN INDIAN TRIBES.

WHEREAS, the Task Force of the Chiefs and Warrior Societies of the Dsi'sti'stas' and Suhtio nations, comprised of the Chiefs, Kit Fox, Dog Soldiers, Elk Horn Scrapers and Bow String Societies, having approached the Northern Cheyenne Tribal Council with concerns for the Tribes present situation regarding the complete loss of tribal headquarters and important tribal documents; and,

WHEREAS, the task force further expressed concerns for the "state of tribal affairs" regarding the desparate socio-economic conditions of the Tribes; and,

WHEREAS, the Task Force further expressed concern that, as a people, the Northern Cheyenne must simply begin to act upon its own conditions if they are to ever improve and that this was a time to strive for stability and not to circumvent the orderly process of tribal government to correct matters that needed correcting, and to support the tribal administration as is now situated so that the orderly and effective function of tribal operations could be restored to the people; and,

WHEREAS, the task force also counseled that this was not the time for anyone to be disruptive to destabilize tribal government, but rather to all cooperatively work together for something better for the people; and,

WHEREAS, the task force further expressed a concern that the Tribe needs to begin preparations for changes to be brought about by the "New Federalism Policies" of the U.S. Congress for American Indian Tribes; and,

WHEREAS, having considered the expressed concerns of the task force, the Northern Cheyenne Tribal Council proceeding under its inherent sovereign powers of internal matters of self government and in accordance with the Tribes Constitution and By-Laws, Article V-Bill of Rights, Section 1., in which all members of the Tribe shall be accorded equal opportunities to participate in the economic resources and activities of the Tribe, hereby decides to enlist the aid of the Chiefs and Warrior Societies through its task force by providing for their active participation in tribal government affairs to bring about a more better and effective government for the Northern Cheyenne people; now,

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THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED the Northern Cheyenne Tribal Council governing authority of the Northern Cheyenne Tribe, hereby provides the task force of the Chiefs and Warrior Societies full participation in tribal affairs concerning restoration of tribal headquarters, revisions to the tribal constitution, and in the formulation of policy in anticipation of changes to be brought about by the "New Federalism Policies" of the U.S. Congress for American Indian Tribes; and,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Northern Cheyenne Tribal Council is of the understanding that the assistance of the task force is on a voluntary basis; and,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Northern Cheyenne Tribal Council recognizes the following members to constitute the task force with the continuing advice and consent of the Chiefs and Warrior Societies as organized within their respective societies:

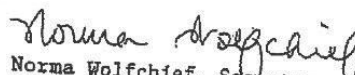

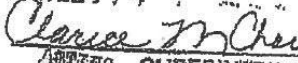
